Review Draft Recommendations for the Lake Saint Louis Comprehensive Plan at the Third Open House for the Comprehensive Plan on Wednesday, April 26th

The public is invited to attend the third open house for the Lake Saint Louis Comprehensive Plan from 5:00 – 7:30 p.m., Wednesday, April 26th at the Lake Saint Louis City Hall (200 Civic Center Drive, Lake Saint Louis, MO 63367). Attendees at the open house will have an opportunity to review the results of the visual preference survey from earlier this spring and review the draft recommendations of the Comprehensive Plan. The public can stop by anytime between 5:00 - 7:30 p.m. A brief presentation will be given at 5:30pm. The same presentation will be repeated at 6:15pm and 7:00pm. In addition, boards and information will be presented, staff and members of the planning team will be available for questions, and there will be a variety of ways for attendees to give input.

“At this open house, attendees will be able to see the key draft recommendation of the comprehensive plan.” said Kathy Schweikert, Mayor of Lake Saint Louis. “We’ve had great input at the first two open houses, community meetings, and surveys that are reflected in the draft recommendations.”

The planning team is led by the i5Group, along with Development Strategies and Shockey Consulting Services. A twelve-person resident Steering Committee is helping guide the process. The Steering Committee has representatives from the Board of Aldermen, Planning and Zoning Commission, and residents from across the city.

"We'll be showing a draft of the future land use plan and other plan components at this open house" said Stephen Ibendahl, Principal of the i5Group. "We'll take what we hear from this open house and begin to finalize the plan."

The planning process started in late summer 2016 and will last through summer 2017. The draft comprehensive plan will be available this summer along with a final open house.
